Hall of Fame Induction Policy

Introduction

Purpose and Scope

The purpose of the Hall of Fame is to recognise those outstanding individuals who have made a significant contribution to the sport of tenpin bowling in South Australia. The primary requirement for selection is a high level of achievement from personal effort or initiative, or in a field of endeavour that contributes to the performances of athletes or to the development and status of the sport. Inductees to the Hall of Fame should be appointed in accordance with the provisions of this Policy.

Hall of Fame Subcommittee

The Hall of Fame committee shall be a subcommittee of the Board of Directors of Tenpin Bowling Australia (SA Division) (Tenpin SA) and shall consist of;

- Four to six members, (at least one from the Tenpin SA Board and at least one existing Hall of Fame member) being in good standing and financial members of Tenpin Bowling Australia(TBA). Such persons to have the required knowledge, experience, competence and integrity to be part of an independent investigation process.

- All members of the committee are to be approved by the Board of Tenpin SA.
- The Chair of the committee will be a director of Tenpin SA.
- The committee will meet as required to ensure an orderly process in making recommendations to the Tenpin SA Board.
- Minutes of all committee meetings must be maintained and made available to all members of the committee and the Tenpin SA Board.

It will be incumbent on a committee member to declare that he or she has an association with a nominee, which may result in the appearance of bias or conflict of interest in the selection process. Where the committee confirms that such an association exists, the member shall be disqualified from any discussion or voting on that nominee.

The function of the committee is to;

- Identify suitable nominees
- Examine nominees identified and gather sufficient information to ensure a fair assessment of their suitability for Hall of Fame membership
- Review the nominee information and request further information on any nominee if it deems it necessary.
- Ensure that all deliberations of the committee remain strictly confidential. Breach of this rule shall result in the person being removed from membership of the committee.
- Recommend to the Board of Tenpin SA the selection of any Nominee to the Hall of Fame.
- Review on an annual basis the Hall of Fame criteria and recommend any changes to the Board of Tenpin SA.

Hall of Fame Criteria

Membership shall be divided into two categories.

- Athletes who have demonstrated sustained and outstanding performances at the highest levels in the sport of tenpin bowling.
- Persons (bowlers and non-bowlers) who have made an extraordinary, inspirational and dedicated personal contribution to tenpin bowling and its development such as administration, coaching, training, sports media/history, sports medicine/science and technology and contributions to the sport in other areas not already listed.

Nominees must:

- Be achievers at the highest level
- Have the support of their peers

Criteria for Athlete Members

- A candidate must have an outstanding record in the appropriate grade or level in tournaments, locally and nationally over a minimum of 15 years.
- Be a member of Tenpin Bowling Australia in good standing during their involvement in the sport.
- Competed in South Australia State Championships and/or represented South Australia in National events.

Criteria for Non Bowlers

Nominees must have made a major contribution at State and National level to the sport of tenpin bowling, over a minimum of 15 years.

Including

- Extraordinary, inspirational and dedicated personal contributions to tenpin bowling and its development beyond that normally expected
- Outstanding contributions that have substantially advanced the sport
- Held in high esteem by their peers/athletes
- Innovative or pioneering approaches to the organisation and management of tenpin bowling
- Contributions that have substantially enhanced the reputation or profile of the sport.

Or any other criteria as determined by the Tenpin SA board.

Inductees into the Hall of Fame will remain members of the Hall of Fame, unless they are removed because of conduct prejudicial to the Hall of Fame and the good name of Tenpin Bowling Australia (SA Division) and the sport in general. The removal of any inductee from the Hall of Fame shall be in accordance with a resolution of the Tenpin SA Board on the recommendation of the Hall of Fame committee.

Nominations

- Will generally be called by the committee on an annual basis and at time agreed by the Tenpin SA Board so that the announcement of new Hall of Fame inductees coincides with a suitable Tenpin SA function.

- Potential inductee can be nominated by a member/non-member of TBA.
- Tenpin SA Board members are permitted to submit nominations.
- Members of the committee are able to put forward nominations for consideration.
- Nomination forms are to be completed with all criteria included and submitted to the Tenpin SA office.

Inductee Recognition

Inductees to the Hall of Fame will

- Where possible, be announced at the Tenpin SA Annual Awards night
- Be sent a congratulatory letter, inviting the individual to the Hall of Fame Awards presentation at a suitable time determined by the Tenpin SA Board
- Receive a plaque/subsequent memento presented at a suitable Tenpin SA Awards Night.
